	<u>Drum Brae/Drum Brae Drive Junction: -</u> First highlighted as a site of concern in 2013, as part of the Council's ongoing Accident Investigation and Prevention (AIP) process, and in December 2018, the Western Edinburgh	

The then Neighbourhood Partnership agreed to allocate the additional funding required to allow a signalised junction to be progressed.

The COVID-19 outbreak has impacted on progress. The consultant has now completed their design work and we are awaiting the outcome of a check by colleagues in the Council's street lighting team of the changes that are proposed to the street lighting apparatus at the junction.

Council would therefore hope to be in a position to commence the process of procuring a contractor to deliver the project within the next month or so and it is expected that the scheme will be constructed in summer/autumn this year.

CEC's Parking Operations team are considering the extension to the yellow lines at the junction. Unfortunately, this proposed TRO did not progress in April 2020 during the pandemic and the disaggregation of the Locality team.

<u>Featherhall LTN:</u> The Active Travel team have included this area in a wider Corstorphine Connections proposal currently under development. £50k remains allocated from the NEP budget (only design costs have been incurred), and further information on this will be circulated in due course.

Dave explained that timelines and communication channels would be agreed once the new team is in place. The new Transport Infrastructure Team is being led by David Wilson (david.wilson@edinburgh.gov.uk)

#### Other projects in project bank:

- Old Coltbridge £10k still allocated to this project but it's hoped that this budget will not be required.
- Ellerslie Road widening query as to whether this remained in project bank?
