1. B)	Sub- group meeting held this week. Main points discussed:	
NN Priority: Health Wellbeing & Social Isolation	Big demand for anxiety management classes. Health in Mind piloted face to face 6-week class at Norton Park to test interest. Found that people are not ready to commit to regular face to face sessions so decided to do local drop ins for now.	
subgroup update - Liz McIntosh	 New initiative to be piloted in GP surgeries in Western with Volunteer Centre. Volunteers will offer supported walks to people who, are not housebound, but a bit anxious about going out. These will be 20-minute weekly walks for 6 weeks combined with linking people in with local activities. Initiative has been delayed due to getting a data sharing agreement in place but should be able to start around Xmas/New Year. 	

	 Keep Safe initiative – initially set up for people with disabilities who are experiencing harassment. Partnership with Police Scotland and the 'I am Me' campaign. Businesses, cafes and libraries can sign up and display a logo that indicates they are a safe place for people to go who are experiencing harassment. Training will be given to staff which will include helping them recognise the symptoms of hate crime and harassment. Scottish Ambulance Service – Looking to develop a way to support people who they have attended after a fall. If staff 'recognise' person is socially isolated they can link them in with other support or signpost them to activities /support in the community. Liz suggested they attend one of the NN meetings which Keith agreed was a good idea. Mapping Exercise – Excel sheet circulated for NN members to populate with groups /activities and contacts for them in their area. Georgena highlighted that all activities in Cramond are in the Kirk. While she can give details of the activities she cannot share contacts due to church data protection policy. Groups are also not advertised on Church website. Georgena also highlighted that people may be reluctant to share their details outside their own local area. Liz highlighted that the main point of the exercise was to get info out to isolated people.
