In particular she was asking whether a contribution from the Organisation was compulsory. Scott and Elaine explained that any changes to form would need full CEC discussion and that a contribution was not compulsory for this fund.	
	It was felt that WNN did like to see where possible that it had at least been considered, and that all projects should be asked if they had considered a contribution towards costs.	
	Sian added for information that CCC's lunch club had been filmed by STV to be shown this evening at 6pm.	
	Scott added under item 4 of previous minute that Craigmount Community Wing Committee had disbanded and that the space was currently being used by school for COVID isolation purposes. He added that his team were hoping to carry out some youth work in the space school soon.	

8. Neighbourhood	Dave Sinclair and David Wilson gave a brief report on two current projects:	
Environment Programme (NEP) Roads	DRUM BRAE DRIVE JUNCTION TRAFFIC SIGNALS: (£80k contribution to project costs) – The scheme to install traffic signals at the junction of Drum Brae and Drum Brae Drive forms part of the Road Safety capital programme.	
	Design work commenced in late 2018, following the confirmation of the NEPs funding contribution to cover the difference in cost between a puffin crossing and a fully signalised junction.	
	The design process is now nearing completion and we anticipate issuing tenders for the scheme in early 2022, to allow construction to take place in the spring. The statutory process to advertise the proposed additional double yellow lines is due to commence early next year. Stacey Monteith-Skelton will share the design with the Drum Brae CC	Design to be shared
	 Comments/ queries: Q Can we be confident that this will actually happen next year? Q Why are certain safety projects outwith schools taking too long now that staff are in post? 	CORSTORPHINE CONNECTIONS – LOW TRAFFIC NEIGHBOURHOOD (£50k contribution in lieu of the Featherhall One-Way proposal) The Corstorphine Connections Low Traffic Neighbourhood (LTN) scheme forms part of the Active Travel Investment Programme. Work commenced on this project in the latter part of 2020. A Concept Design has since been developed for an	
	LTN and this was then the subject of an extensive community engagement exercise, the results of which were reported to the Transport & Environment Committee on 19 August.	
	We are now progressing towards implementation of the LTN on a trial basis, under an Experimental Traffic Regulation Order (ETRO). It is intended to deliver a further report to the Committee in January 2022, with a view to proceeding with the trial from spring next year.

Community Engagement	 First discussion on what the community's perception of community engagement by Edinburgh Zoo revealed: Until now, not really aware of any specific engagement opportunities Have found it difficult to get in touch with the right people Years ago, there was good engagement but seems to have stopped until now Tommy added that he welcomed this discussion and felt that we needed to see this as an opportunity for wider community and not just a chance to ask for free entry. He also questioned how this might be managed in a coordinated way rather than each project trying to get in. Ben spoke about some current and developing partnerships eg Scottish Autism, Corstorphine Primary, and keen to try to use a blank sheet approach to look at ways to increase enjoyment of the Zoo without additional barriers such as cost or physical access.	
	 Keen that they are 'fulcrum' to a stronger local community and that they had secured some funding to support a post to develop this. Comments / queries: Widespread excitement at opportunities being discussed to bring the Zoo closer to the community Possible links with the Employability group of the LCPP (Local Community Planning Partnership). Key contact here is Nick Croft, Edinburgh College - <u>Nick.Croft@edinburghcollege.ac.uk</u> Great that Zoo are developing an engagement strategy, but who has given the community's voice to this? Ben explained that the Strategy will be launched in Spring and that Engagement is only one part of it. He will then be talking to the community through groupings like this one. Hope that community groups buy into this and help shape the strategy. See this as a two-way education opportunity with Zoo learning from local communities as well as us learning from the Zoo Friends of Corstorphine Hill would be a good link as well as Communities of Faith (Esther Elliot - esther.elliott@wpcscotland.co.uk)

	Elaine said that she had proposed a deadline for new applications by 19 th January to allow for decisions at meeting on 9 th Feb 2022.

	Scott gave report from Steven Kipanda, saying that he was attempting to 'close the loop' with young people, asking if priorities from most recent YouthTalk activity are still valid to them.	
	Steven was in the process of meeting school staff, accepting that this is a slow process as schools are under a lot of pressure. He has also been meeting with local youth providers including SE Scotland scouts, Local churches who are happy to support.
