1. Welcome and	Cllr Max Mitchell welcomed the group, and those present introduced themselves.

2. Minute of	The minute was accepted as true record.

	There were no other matters arising that weren't on the agenda.	
3. Drylaw parks	Helen reported that Scott Donkin had met with Insp Elliot to discuss concerns. It was thought that	
	the group of 13-14-year olds attend Craigroyston High School and are causing criminal damage	
	and anti-social behaviour around Drylaw / Telford and Maidencraig. They are all being engaged	
	already by various youth providers – Fet Lor, Pilton Youth and Childrens Project (PYCP) and	
	Granton Youth Project (GYP) and that they appear to respect these visits.	
	Cllr Osler – we need there to someone who leads on / coordinates this multi-pronged strategy and ensures that actions are followed through. Could the interventions be mapped to give a	

	better understanding? She added that a major concern is the sheer number of individuals: often as many as 20-30 which can be intimidating. Jenny added that the Church was still working with Ferrywell Youth Club to engage some of the same young people but that they don't seem to be in the loop with other pieces of work going on. Please add John Gillan john.gillan@ferrywell.org.uk to any communications. She added that it would be good to keep Head Teacher at Ferryhill in loop too. Helen said that one of the LLDOs (Lifelong Learning Development Officers) Jackie Barr has been asked to try to engage with them on a one to one basis to develop relationships to address these issues and help them understand consequences of their actions. Dave suggested that the issue was a wider societal lack of respect and that even Police don't find it easy to engage with these young people who know that nothing is likely to happen, and Cllr Osler added that adults often set a bad example. Cllr Mitchell reported that Richard Townsend (Housing Officer) was trying to get community buy in regarding a clean up of the stretch from Red Bridge to Drylaw Park. 4. Locality Community Planning Partnership (LCPP) Update	Joan explained that the LCPP had met that day and that the full minutes would be available soon. She highlighted a presentation on the 20-minute neighbourhoods that was given by Daisy Narayanan, who she thought would be good to be invited to the NN to chat about what this will actually look like. Cllr Mitchell added that she would be visiting Community Councils to get the views of local people. Joan also explained that a change in the Council's structures was underway and that Andrew Field would now be leading City wide on Community Empowerment, which included Community Councils, Neighbourhood Networks and LCPPs. 	Dave asked if additional resources would be available to support increased community development? It was noted that we do not anticipate new resources in current financial climate.	
5. Inverleith NN Priority – Greenspace and growing	Joan reported that the subgroup had not met and thought this this needed new impetus.	
6. Community Grants Funding	Elaine reported that the funding panel was unable to meet formally on 24 th as planned as only two members present, and it was agreed to discuss the new applications.	
	The balance of the Inverleith NN was £19,845 and three new applications were presented for consideration totalling £13,900 as detailed below.	
	The new applications for consideration are below:	
	LifeCare Edinburgh INN/03/2021-22	
	Request £5000 to refurbish an unused outdoor space to make it more attracting and welcoming, as detailed in their application form.	
	Total costs are £5058 for excavation and formation of timber planters (£2,262) and Treated timber framing and gating for area (£2,796).	
	A full award was recommended £5000	
	MIND YOU INN/04/2021-22	

	Mind You aim to improve the mental health and well-being of children and young people by educating them in mindfulness practices.	
	They request £3900 to promote and run their fun and engaging sessions in Inverleith Park, with one for P1-P3s and second for P4s to S1s, over four weeks for 1 hour each, with 15 children in each group. There will be five programmes in total as detailed in their application form.	
	The total cost of the project is £3900, covering £3640 in sessional staffing hours plus £60 for arts and crafts and £200 for healthy snacks.	
	Due to concerns about this project's evidence of track record, and clarity of activity, a NIL award was recommended, with invitation to be made to the to reapply in future if they were able t provide above information.	
	A NIL award was recommended	
	The Yard INN/05/2021-22 Following vandalism in Dec 2021, they have requested £5000 to renew some areas that were damaged, in particular the Boardwalk that wasn't covered by their insurance as detailed in their application form.	
	The total cost of project is £11,278 and they have raised the additional £6278	
	A full award was recommended £5000	
	Elaine reported, if above were approved, a balance of £9845 would remain and that applications were expected imminently.	Recommendations to be made as agreed

	Malcolm reported that the Model Boat Club had cleared out the pond and were shocked at the amount of litter dumped there.
