1. Welcome and Introductions	Cllr Gavin Barrie welcomed the group, and those present introduced themselves.	
2. Minute of previous meeting	The minute was accepted as true record.	
	There were no other matters arising that weren't on the agenda.	
3. Drylaw parks	This issue had been raised by Cllr Osler and Jenny following vandalism in the area.	
	Jenny explained that concerns were that local young people were looking for engagement and social interaction, and the big question is how do we better engage with them? She added that this had	

	potential to link with the greenspace / growing priority but asked how we get young people attracted to volunteering in this way?	
	 Comments / queries: How do we know what the communities want? There had been extensive consultation in the past around skatepark and also around greenspace but much of this is out of date. Elaine reported that she had reached out to Edinburgh & Lothians Greenspace Trust, who might be interested in applying for funding to carry out some engagement work. Main issues currently in community seem to be request for a skip to remove flytipping across area and wider than greenspace only, as can be seen on DTCA social media. Alex added that DTCA had a key role to play in this. Carol added that libraries had a very active social media presence and that this could be used to reach out to potential volunteers and also to help educate the public. She added that libraries also had a community space that could be used and was happy for contact to be shared. Carol.marr@edinburgh.gov.uk Gavin added that local people needed to reach out to Community Council, or to elected members to ask for help in dealing with issues. Jenny asked how we network better? Alex asked what had happened to the picnic area idea in Easter Drylaw Park (?), and also why the greenspace at Wester Drylaw Row was being allowed to grow high, and why one bin had been removed meaning that the remaining one often overflowed and was left on grass when emptied? Main wishes from young people seem to be replacement goal posts, but it was acknowledged that these had been replaced and vandalised so now difficult decision for parks. 	 Helen added that the Lifelong Learning team was recruiting at moment and would hopefully have some new youth work resource in the new year, so engagement work in this area could be looked at. Jenny reported that she is working with Ferrywell Youth Club and Street Soccer with a group of young men meeting behind the church, and that this was going well, although only able to meet once a month. 4. Getting to know	Drylaw Neighbourhood Centre	
you	Roy, Manager of Drylaw Neighbourhood Centre gave a presentation (attached) and spoke about the history of the project and its current facilities and programme.	Presentation to be attached

	He reported that, thanks to funding from Sc Government, they are able to employ a volunteer supporter which supports work in their garden, and that this project had circulated almost three quarters of a ton of fresh produce in the community last year. They had also had produce commended by Botanic Gardens, and regularly did litter picks with young people in the parks. He also highlighted some partnership work taken / taking place for example with Fet-Lor Youth Club and with local college and that they had been part of the COVID 19m Response group. Comments / queries: Joan asked if the young people were involved in volunteering in the garden. Roy explained that yes this was the case but was very funding dependant. Joan asked if they allowed parties eg kids birthdays and Roy agreed that this did bring in some income but that he was having to restrict these to younger children as difficult to manage within current restrictions. Roy stated that DNC would be keen to be involved in any greenspace / growing ideas around Drylaw Telford areas.

		Max highlighted that the plan was very high level and this stage and that more detail was needed to understand its priorities.	
		Joan explained that Friends of Inverleith Park had been involved and that there had been open invitations for groups to attend a consultation event. They had also set up a stall in the park.	
		Elaine explained that she had received email from Diane Cassidy, Green Spaces Development saying:	
		"We have had a number of online and face to face meetings with park stakeholders, one of which recently mentioned the existence of the Inverleith Network Neighbourhood.	
		I have attached the presentation from the Landscape Architects (circulated) given to the various stakeholder groups and I wondered if you would be able to distribute it further. Also, would there be an opportunity for the Landscape Architects to present it to your members?	Elaine to circulate and to invite to next meeting
		It would be great to hear any comments and ideas before the plan is finalised. We are working with Rankin Fraser landscape architecture to pull together ideas for a new masterplan for Inverleith Park. This plan will form the basis of future changes and improvements to the park over coming years. "
