Growing Area – Maidencraig

This project currently suspended (to create some raised and ground level beds for fruit and vegetables growing and seating). Residents Chair recently resigned and no discussions have taken place about any development since. CEC small minority owner in block, would need to keen interest from a majority of existing tenants to justify HRA spend, but happy to revisit this in the future.

Land between 1&2 – 3&4 Saunders Street

David has engaged the landscape architect for Saunders Street proposal (Improving HRA communal public realm, crowning trees, new public benches, removal of old signage) and he's just waiting on a price. We have asked them to carry out a consultation to gather ideas, and to deliver a concept design- from there a final design.

3&5 Telford Drive-Lighting Improvements

David has spoken with Street Lighting and met them onsite to look at the job (installation of new modern lighting and crowning all trees in CEC ownership to promote better use of area). They will deliver a design to us but have stated that the two trees one in 3 and 1 in 5 Telford Drive will cause issues. We don't own the trees, which belong to the bottom flats (owners). One tree has a protection order on it. It is the roots of the trees that are causing the problem we would have to cut through the root systems to install the ducting for the lighting column this will destabilise the 2 trees which are in red zone falling distances to buildings and roads and a high risk to life or injury. We will continue to review options.

Easter Drylaw Walkabouts

No walkabouts have taken place in a while. David Stevenson to arrange an autumn appointment to see what we may agree together.

Overgrown communal area- Wester Drylaw Drive

Nominated by Cllr Nicolson, David Stevenson is exploring options for this site which is overgrown communal garden area, with an owner occupier in place. We are unable to take the lead on a Tenement Management Scheme piece of work so may need a capital NEP with low maintenance surface.

	Joan gave brief update on current work of Friends of Inverleith Park:	
	 Hoping to secure funding soon to plant 75 new trees, which would be in little groves and not in areas that would impact on useable space. 	
	 They are also looking into getting water supplied into sundial garden to reduce workload of volunteers and to help upkeep of the garden. 	
	Cllr Nicolson asked for update on the Over the Bridge festival which had not gone ahead. Cllr Mitchell reported that the application had been withdrawn to look at how it might be revised for next year. It was noted that community benefit had been lost.	
8. Community Grants Funding	Elaine reported that INN still had a full allocation of £24990 to support projects this financial year.	
	One application had been received and circulated to all members (in absence of funding panel), and that three positive comments had been received:	
	The Yard (INN01/2022-23) requested £1447 to purchase new Go-Carts for use by their members who were disabled children and young people and their families.	
	It was agreed to recommend supporting this project in full, which would leave a balance of £23,543 and to fully promote the community grants fund. Elaine agreed to supply a poster to elected members and wider membership for circulation to their networks and social media.	Action – Elaine
	It was also agreed to put out call for funding panel members to resurrect this process of assessing and recommending projects.	Action – Elaine

	 Boardwalk had been fenced off for some time and asked for information on reasons and timescales for repair / reopening? Joan added that the boardwalk had been repaired in 2020-21 thanks to a grant from this group and expressed concern if it was still not sound. Pond is suffering from weeds / duckweed and is now too much for Boat Club members to maintain. Bins at pond are constantly overflowing, causing littering in pond and around. He explained that several emails / phone calls had not been effective in getting work done. He agreed to copy in Clirs plus Friends of Inverleith Park in correspondence.
