3. Forth NN priority update (Poverty)	Willie B spoke to the circulated update from R2 group. He explained that they met every 3 months, and a Development Working Group met every 6 weeks.	
	They have been granted 3 years funding from the Scottish Government for an R2 Co-ordinator post. Details to follow once it is all finalised. A meeting is due to take place to discuss problems of damp / mould issues that people in the area were facing.	
4. Local Community Planning Project (LCPP)	George G is now Chair of the NW LCPP and continues to share minute of this group with the LCPP and vice versa for the purpose of communication and information. George added that on this occasion the LCPP minute was not available.	
	George reported that there was consultation taking place surrounding the LIP priorities and the current three priorities which are social isolation, employment and skills, and the North West area had been consulted upon to see if three priorities are still current and relevant and that it is important for people to get involved to shape the new plans and to ensure that it reflects the current position and thinking.
