The following items were also discussed by the funding panel:

Cost of living crisis – Steve recognised that applications such as Western NN Community Support Group and others maybe vital in future years as no end in sight. It was suggested that the panel look favourably at future applications to tackle this growing issue.

Edinburgh Art Fair, on behalf of a local constituted group, and looking at doing an art mural on the walls of Balgreen Tunnel. Although much of the proposed community activity would take place in SW boundary of the tunnel, it was felt that this would improve the area and that Western may also benefit. It was suggested that we wait until their application to SW Neighbourhood Network was discussed and ask them to apply here for a contribution if appropriate.

Tummies not Trash had received a grant of £5000 to support volunteer recruitment, training and venue costs, with the majority being for hire of Saughtonhall Community Hall. They have made savings in spend by taking some of their training and recruitment sessions online and have discovered that the Community Hall is not ideal for sorting and storing food for distribution. Their request was to use some unspent element of their award to hire one or two vans over the Christmas period and this was agreed.
