

– greenspace consultation	 This consultation aims to build on a previous consultation that took place n 2005, which resulted in investment into the area such as the Skatepark In recent years local people have expressed a concern about some issues in our open spaces Drylaw Telford Community Council (DTCC) decided there was a need to consult local people to establish what their priorities are for our open spaces. The grant of £5000 awarded by Inverleith NN in Dec 2022 will support this consultation. Engagement strategy is now complete, and a hard copy questionnaire will be available as well as an online version that will be shared on social media etc. Posters and questionnaires will be distributed to local shops, schools and community facilities. 	Maidencraig: We have an engineering design for the new bin store area, but the engineers estimate came back at £72k, (original estimate was £34,500), the new estimate takes into consideration a reinforced concrete retaining wall.
