Reports by CEE team are now complete and will be presented to Culture and Communities Committee on 8 August. ( <u>Link to this committee here</u> ).	
	<b>Transformation and Improvement Plan</b> - Meanwhile, the Edinburgh Partnership are carrying out a Community Planning improvement exercise, which will be presented to the October meeting of the <u>Police and Sustainability Committee</u> .

5.	Social Isolation priority sub group	Tommy gave the following update. He said that the work of the Joint Social Isolation group very much ties with community involvement. Current issues being discussed / tackled are:  Community Transport - remains a huge barrier for voluntary groups to provide services for older people in particular. Still waiting for communication from a CEC Manager. Has been no communication for some time and group feeling not listened to.	
		Joint VSF Leaflet – been in production since March 2022, funded by NN. Has had positive feedback and attracts people to activities and events. Issues are that a) VSF is not eligible applicant for Community Grants Fund, and b) need a local group to hold any cash. Cist is around £110 per month. Welcome thoughts on whether it is worth continuing or not?	
		<b>Befriending service locally</b> – working with Vintage Vibes to recruit local volunteers to be able to provide a service in this locality. Recruitment working to some extent, but welcome ideas on recruiting volunteers.	
		<b>Poverty / Cost of Living</b> - Tommy updated the group in that the Western Edinburgh Community Support Group, funded by CGF, has been able to help tackle food poverty and going forward aim to help move people out of food poverty. 120 families were supported over Christmas period through schools but feel that this is only just scaping the surface of local need.
