1.Welcome	Tommy agreed to chair the meeting until Steve arrived. Tommy welcomed the group, and introduced Evelyn

	Evelyn informed the members that she is now manging both areas on a temporary basis, as Peter Strong has now	
	retired from the CEC.	

2.Notes of Western NN Meeting of 10.02.21	The notes were Approved.	
3.Western NN - Social Isolation Sub-Group	Tommy had sent out two papers in advance. One from the western NN (WNN) subgroup meeting and another from the Western Almond Voluntary Sector Forum meeting whereby the issue of social isolation was the focus of both meetings.	
Update	Tommy gave some background information as to when and why social isolation has become a priority issue as identified at several meetings last year. Highlighting that the issue, a major impact of the pandemic, is now one of the three North West Edinburgh Locality Improvement Plan (LIP) priorities.	
	A discussion took place regarding levels of isolation, it was agreed that lots of people need different levels of support, different age groups, a different transition stages of life. However, Tommy indicated that rather than for example setting up a befriending service, any approach might be perhaps a light touch a <i>"lend and elbow approach."</i> However, that service would need to be supported and co-ordinated locally, with the appropriate checks, paperwork and training, which would need to be provided.	
	Concerns had been expressed by some members of the WNN regarding the duplication of services and having two Social Isolation subgroups. Tommy explained the Voluntary Sector Forum meeting is made of different representatives and organisations and covers both the Western and Almond areas. The strength of NN was it can go through and get support from CEC. The overall aim is to work together and not duplicate. Digital Inclusion was also highlighted as a key concern, especially amongst older people in the community and this highlighted issues in respect of how activities to encourage people into more social opportunities might be missed.	
	Pauline mentioned the Edinburgh Volunteer Centre has been present at the Voluntary Sector meeting and has a Task Force of volunteers that can offer light touch services. Tommy explained they would not have the capacity to offer the admin support but could recommend trainers.	
	Scott highlighted that social isolation was on a sliding scale and that it was a massive issue. He suggested that the development of the wider Locality Improvement Plan priority would likely welcome some smaller approaches as the issue is so wide and will be challenging across the whole of the NW locality. Scott added that when the potential to develop Social Isolation was raised pre pandemic, there was a suggestion to undertake a mapping exercise to help	Scott to identify a member of staff to

	Members discussed the introduction of 'local' criteria that would link to the ambitions of the network:	
	• Thematic: Applications which will support the theme of Social Isolation (across all age groups) are to be encouraged;	
	 Repeat applications: Whilst generally accepted that applications would be welcomed from different 	
	organisations, Esther highlighted some concerns that this perhaps shouldn't prevent organisations from applying for different projects. It was agreed Community Grants can be awarded to same org as long as it's for a different project.	
	• Youth Decides: Cllr Aldridge suggested that this should be reintroduced as a means of encouraging young people to be proactively involved with decision making. It was agreed to ring fence some of the 2021-22 Community grant budget, the sum of between £5000 - £10,000 was agreed.	Scott to identify staff to support the process.
